A MESSAGE FROM THE PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT

Recycling should be placed out by **7 a.m.** on the scheduled collection day every **Wednesday** (either on the curb in front of the home or in the alley where your garbage is picked up), except for during weeks that have a Monday or a Wednesday holiday. 24-gallon recycling bins may be purchased at City Hall during normal business hours.

| <p style="text-align: center;">Mixed Residential Paper</p> <p>Newspaper, magazines, paperboard boxes (cereal boxes, etc.), mail, junk mail, office paper, phone books, paperback books, cardboard, (must be flattened)</p> | <p style="text-align: center;">Cans</p> <p>Food and beverage cans made of tin, aluminum, steel (should be rinsed)</p> |
| <p style="text-align: center;">Glass</p> <p>Unbroken, rinsed food & beverage containers that are clear, brown, or green in color</p> | <p style="text-align: center;">Plastic</p> <p>Plastic containers with #1 through #6 recycling symbol on the container, such as milk, detergent, soft drink, juice, water, shampoo, liquid soap bottles (should be rinsed)</p> |

UNACCEPTABLE ITEMS

Household trash, aluminum foil, auto/window glass, ceramics, china/dishes, drink boxes with straws, hard-cover books, light bulbs, waxed milk & juice cartons, no Styrofoam of any kind (cups, plates, food containers, peanuts, or packaging materials), plastic toys/bags, wire clothes hangers, yard waste, plastic/glass/metal containers that held hazardous materials such as motor oil, paint, pesticide or weed killer
